

## How to sign your will

### It's as easy as 1..... 2 ..... 3

Please follow these instructions very carefully **as any deviation may render your will invalid.**

**1. Sign your will** - Now that you have printed your will you must ensure that it is signed and witnessed to make it **legally binding**. Unless the will has been completed signed and witnessed correctly it will be invalid or of no effect

**2. Get your will witnessed** - You must sign the will in the presence of your witnesses who must also sign in your presence and the presence of each other. See below an example of how your will should look when signed and witnessed by **2 independent people** (i.e. persons not related to you or anyone named in the will). Space is also provided on each page for you and your witnesses to sign. Therefore you must ensure **all persons** are present at the time of signing and witnessing the will.

### **3. Store the original will in a safe place**
